Many of us have lived in this building for a long time, some for almost 30 years. \_\_\_\_\_ (*city/ town*) is our community. We have connections, churches, and family here.

We would like to set up negotiations between yourself and representatives of our tenant association to try to find the fair balance. Many tenant associations in the Boston have met with owners and negotiated multi-year agreements that gave a fair return to owners, provided security to resident families, and increased neighborhood stability. We seek to make such an agreement here.
